DESCRIPTOR:

- Continue to build on community partnerships and positive perceptions of our Catholic school board through explicit Catholic practices, teachings, and beliefs.
- Interweave our board theme to guide and support our daily interactions with one another and inform the positive ways that we relate to each other, the community, and the world as a whole.
- Ensure the delivery of quality Religious and Family Life Education and Catholic Character Development Curriculum throughout the Board.
- Provide the essential resources for school communities to fully explore and bring to life the seasons of the liturgical year.
- Continue to use Catholic Professional Learning Communities to support student learning and achievement, and the faith development of all staff.
- Nurture the home–school–parish triad for the mutual benefit of students, families, staff, clergy, parishioners, and the broader community.
- Foster an environment where an awareness of cultural, economic, and spiritual differences are embraced and an understanding of differences is celebrated, knowing that we are all children of God, created in God's image.

- Foster participation in environmental initiatives (waste free lunch, Earth Hour, community clean up).
- Promote EcoSchools Certification for each school.
- Develop solutions to complex environmental, social, and economic issues to support each school community.
- Remove barriers for students of all ethnic and cultural backgrounds, students who are marginalized, as well as students who identify as LGBTQ+ and Two-Spirit, in order for every learner to have an equal opportunity to succeed.
- Identify and eliminate racism by assessing and monitoring organizational structures, policies, programs, practices, and attitudes to ensure that they are fair and equitable for all members of the CDSBEO community.
- Deepen school participation in school breakfast programs and food drives.
- Foster safe learning environments that ensure the mental and physical health of our students as a priority.
- Inquire, collect, and analyze data to inform necessary supports for student learning, mental health and wellbeing.
- Set priorities for the use of fiscal resources which are consistent with the Board's Vision and Mission statements, and comply with the Ministry of Education's mandates, regulations, and guidelines.
- Provide transparency and accountability regarding the allocation of resources through the internal and external audit committees, and through the provision of financial reports to the Board three times per year.

- Ensure the permeation of insightful Religious and Family Life Education and Catholic Virtue teachings in all curriculum throughout the Board.
- Provide opportunities for learners to explore diverse viewpoints and voices with a special emphasis on marginalized and Indigenous voices.
- Build awareness and understanding around First Nation, Métis and Inuit history, perspective, and culture.
- Develop the 21st century competencies: Creativity and Innovation, Collaboration, Communication, Critical Thinking.
- Develop ethical entrepreneurial skills including leadership, initiative, and imagination.
- Engage in collaborative work focused on student learning and achievement through reflection, dialogue, and inquiry.
- Model appropriate problem-solving strategies and provide students with multiple opportunities to apply their learning, so that students engage in meaningful discourse and activities that are authentic and relevant to daily life.
- Deepen the focus on universal design for learning and differentiated instruction to meet the learning needs of all students and increase critical thinking skills.
- Practice our shared belief that all students can reach their potential given sufficient support.
- Foster the mental health and well-being of students through explicitly teaching social-emotional learning, empathy, and self-regulation.
