Mrs. Norton, Mr. Hobbs and Ms. Crawford presented the PowerPoint Presentation virtually to participants. While presenting in a collaborative fashion, presenters spoke individually about respective board data and information as outlined in the presentation.

## Q&A:

Participants were provided the opportunity to pose questions by way of virtual chat or through other means such as email following the presentation. The Q&A has been listed below.

## Question #1:

Assuming the current stage of COVID-19 does not change, is there potential for Community Use of Schools to resume in September and when would we know?

### **Answer:**

CDSBEO-This is difficult to answer at this time as school boards are currently working diligently on school re-entry plans with one scenario being an adaptive cohorting model/approach. The Ministry of Education in conjunction with Public Health Officials will be making the decision on which model boards will role out in September, UCDSB and CDSBEO will take direction from the MOE. It is unlikely we will resume community use to the public upon re-entry to school in September.

UCDSB-I echo the CDSBEO's comments. Another important factor is custodial services/staff and the enhanced cleaning requirements. Tremendous financial means is going into custodial services and support in order for the board to adhere to the health and safety guidelines and maintain clean and healthy facilities for all staff and students. If it becomes possible for us to accommodate community users and approval has been provided by the local public health officials and the Board of Trustees is open to resuming public use of facilities, we will certainly entertain that.

## Question #2:

In planning scenarios for return to school, with one scenario being regular school day/regular class size, how can schools accommodate that number of students? Would the school board be looking to engage community partners from municipalities in conversation regarding use of municipal space (e.g. Williamstown Public School)?

## **Answer:**

UCDSB- From a space and staffing perspective, this would be very localized as Upper Canada does have access space that can be utilized at other schools. For example, Williamstown Public School could utilize access space at Char-Lan District High School. This is important for us to know that municipalities do have an appetite for this.

CDSBEO-As it relates to the conventional type model/scenario, physical distancing would not be attached to this model as physical distancing measures could not be maintained.

# **Question #3:**

Will the schools be open to presentations from guests in person or virtual?

## **Answer:**

CDSBEO-This will be determined by the mode of delivery. If cohorting model is used it is unlikely we will invite guests into schools. We would be minimizing entry into schools.

UCDSB-This pandemic has provided a wider and deeper understating of technology. Technology is a very extensive resource. Our focus for the first few months upon re-entry will be keeping students and staff safe and taking one day at a time.

## Question #4:

How do you see before and after school programs fitting into your plans to keep the children in their classroom cohorts?

Both Boards will take direction from local public health on accommodating before and after school programs in schools for September if a cohorting model is chosen by the Ministry of Education.
