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### Behavior Management System (BMS) Training:

CDSBEO BMS trainers will conduct in-person practitioner training for all Principals and Vice-Principals at the end of September and early October. The BMS Practitioner Training program, developed by OESC and the Ontario Ministry of Education, addresses the need for an effective and cost-efficient behavioral intervention program tailored to school settings. Reading Intervention Teachers (RITs):

RITs are training school staff on facilitating the rollout of the Acadience reading screening for all <u>second-year kindergarten to grade 2 students</u>. The goal is to complete the first round of screening by the end of November.

IEP and IPRC Workshops:

Special Education Consultants are providing voluntary virtual training for Special Education Resource Teachers and Special Education Classroom Teachers on the Special Education module in Aspen and IEP writing. This training is in preparation for the October 16th IEP deadline.
