- 5. Inspiring Behaviour Change: Making a Difference Each Day Sandy O'Doherty, Lead Registered Behaviour Analyst

Throughout the presentation, Sandy explained how we can examine ways in which we can inspire behaviour change by incorporating antecedent interventions which are aimed to help students move forward each and every day.

Antecedent interventions encourage a preventive approach to supporting students who struggle, or have a history of struggling, at different times through their day. They emphasize a proactive rather than a reactive approach to behaviour change.

Antecedent strategies in which our CDSBEO educators implement that are successful in supporting our students include:

- Incorporating what interests the student, including meaningful interests can make a task more enjoyable and reduce the likelihood of task refusal and its associated behaviour.
- Interspersing tasks that have been mastered by the student with tasks they find more difficult can effectively serve to increase student engagement and decrease the aversiveness of a challenging task.
- Increasing opportunity for choice can increase responses, task completion, and duration of work output.
- Behaviour momentum is the practice of presenting a student with tasks they are most likely to do and then introduce a less preferred task.

Inspiring behaviour change supports students in accessing more learning opportunities, generating more positive social contacts, and building more meaningful relationships.
